

RESOLUTION
of the Second International Interparty Conference
“State Sovereignty and the Principles of International Relations in the
Context of Multipolarity and Diversity in the 21st Century”

May 28, 2026
Brest, Republic of Belarus

We, the participants in the Second International Interparty Conference “State Sovereignty and the Principles of International Relations in the Context of Multipolarity and Diversity in the 21st Century,” held on May 28, 2026, in Brest, Republic of Belarus, guided by the provisions of the Charter of the United Nations of June 26, 1945:

emphasize our unconditional commitment to respecting the sovereignty of independent states;

note that the development of friendly and mutually respectful relations among nations is indispensable for ensuring global security and humanity's progress;

categorically reject the imposition of unilateral economic sanctions by certain states and interstate blocs, the use of political pressure, and practices of blatant interference in the internal affairs of other countries;

firmly condemn the escalation of military tensions, the arms race, and the unjustified use of force in resolving international disputes.

We call upon all progressive political forces around the world to take effective measures to:

development of fundamental legal principles, as well as the security architecture of a future multipolar world order capable of minimizing contradictions and ensuring the international community's evolutionary development;

prompt settlement of existing armed conflicts that threaten global security;

lifting of the illegal sanctions imposed by Western countries on states that pursue sovereign policies and are subjected to unlawful restrictions;

restoration of the supremacy of international law over the “rule of force” as the sole legitimate basis for resolving regional and global problems.

To further strengthen our cooperation, we pledge to:

coordinate inter-party efforts to ensure dialogue and mutual support in defending national interests in the international arena and in safeguarding electoral sovereignty, historical memory, and truth;

maintain a continuous exchange of relevant political information and experience in party building for mutual education and personnel training, and to counter misinformation and hybrid threats;

actively participate in international observation of electoral campaigns to strengthen democracy and the legitimacy of the results; to prevent falsifications and the dissemination of distorted interpretations;

pay special attention to collaboration in training youth activists and to supporting the development of youth policy programs;

The participants in the Conference, united by the common goal of building a just multipolar world order, will continue their efforts to consolidate progressive patriotic forces across states worldwide to exert a positive influence on global political processes and prevent a Third World War.
